



RACING AND WAGERING WESTERN AUSTRALIA

WARNING ON THE USE OF AMINOCAPROIC ACID

Trainers and others in the racing industry are warned that aminocaproic acid is a prohibited substance and as such is screened for in race day samples.

Industry participants are also warned that there are currently no registered veterinary or human pharmaceuticals available in Australia that contain aminocaproic acid and therefore it has no legitimate use in racing horses. The presence in a racing stable of any product containing aminocaproic acid would be an offence under the provisions of AR80E and HR194, and the presence of aminocaproic acid in a swab sample would be deemed to be a prohibited substance under the rules of racing.
