**Off the Track**

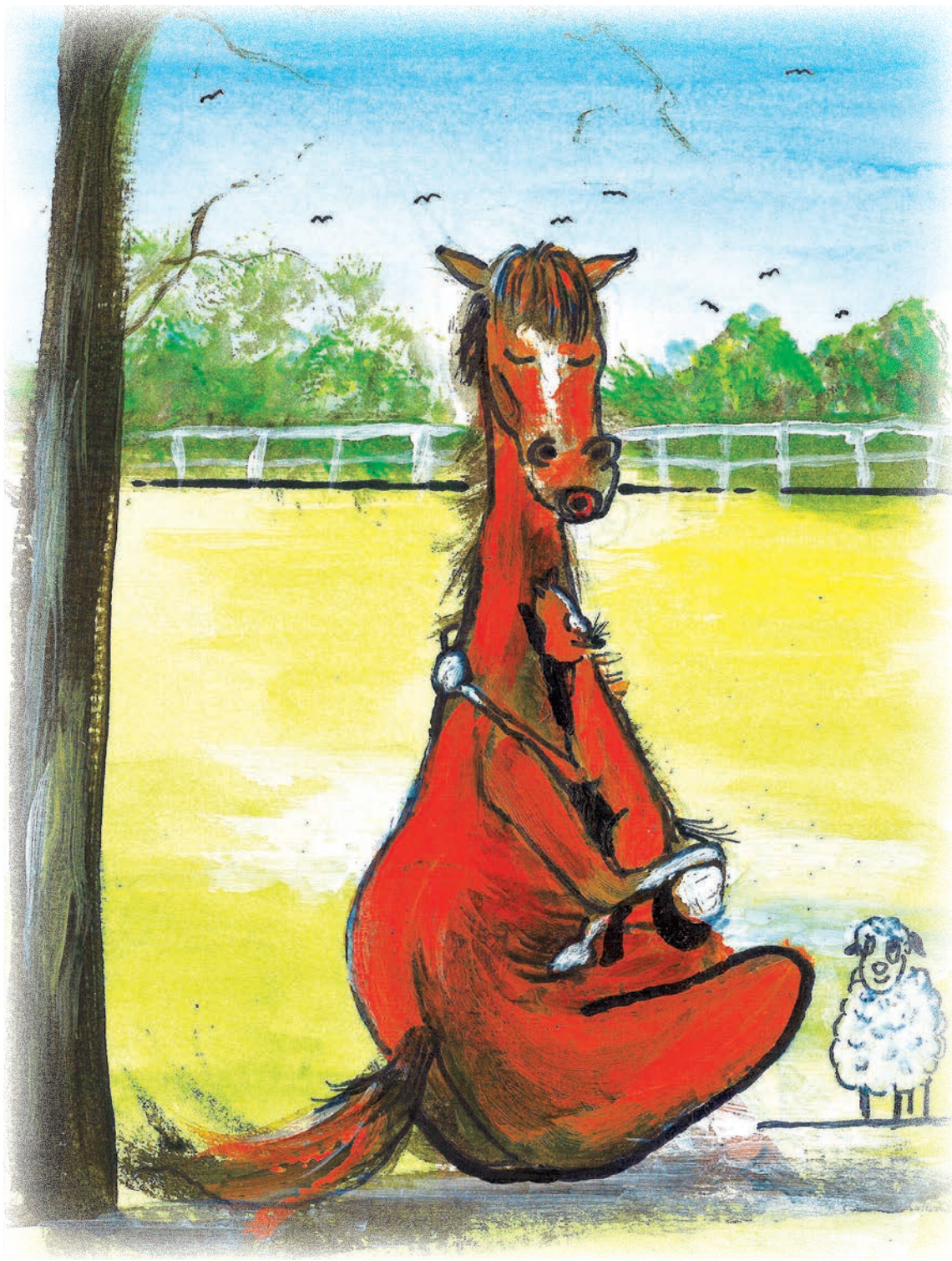
*Supporting Western Australian Retired Racehorses*

and so can you.



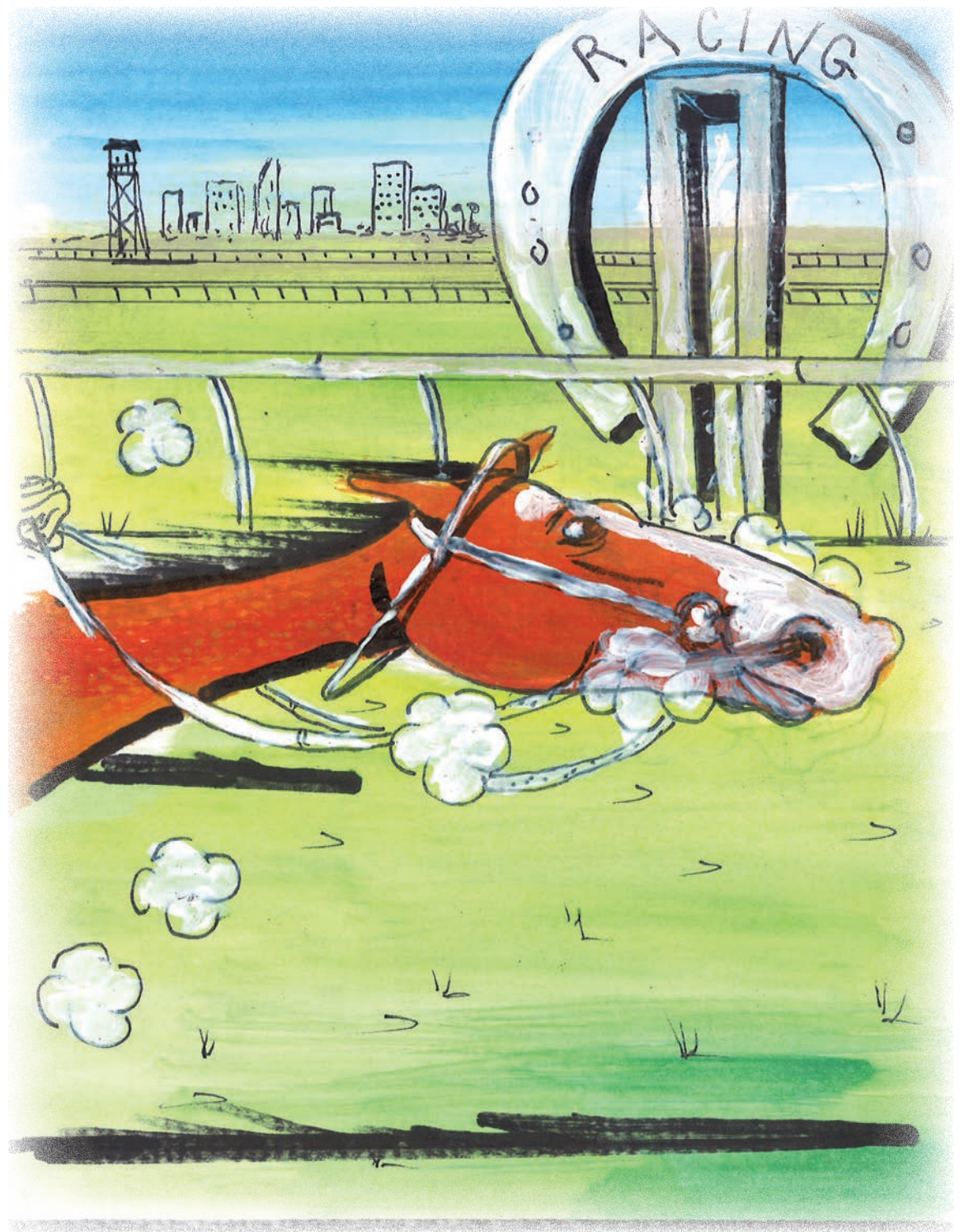




I have a calm nature.

the fastest I could go.



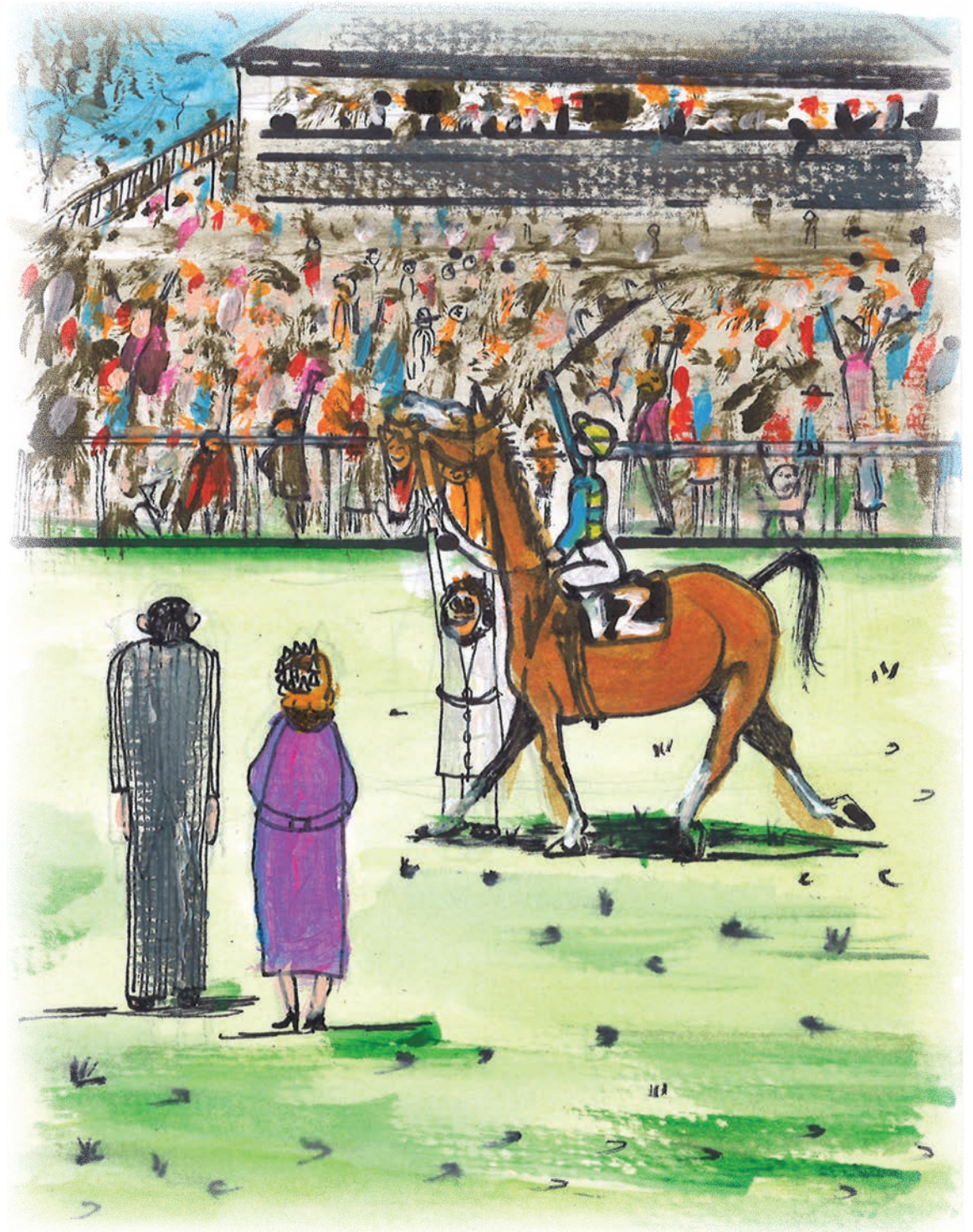




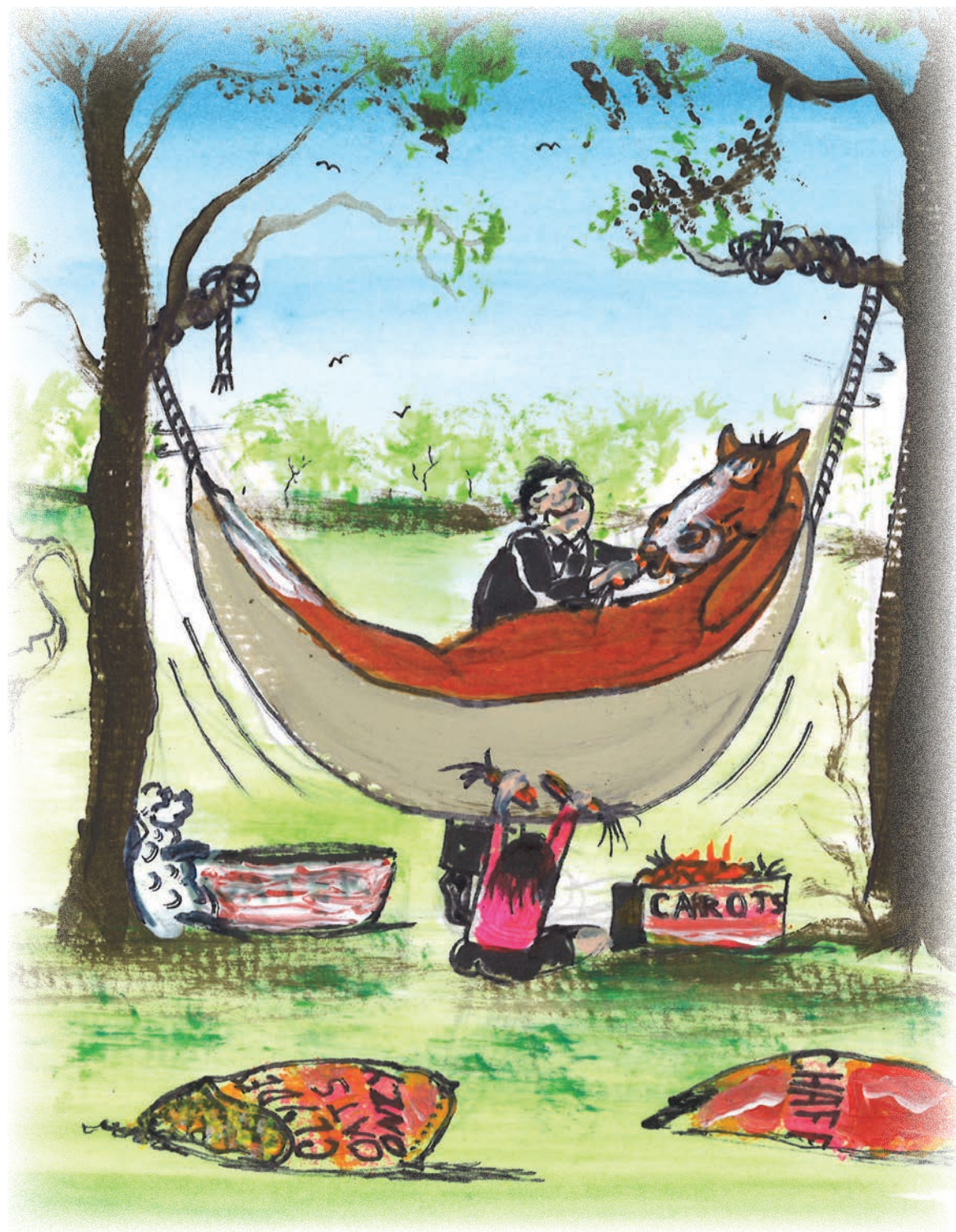
Racing was exciting,

She really is very keen.



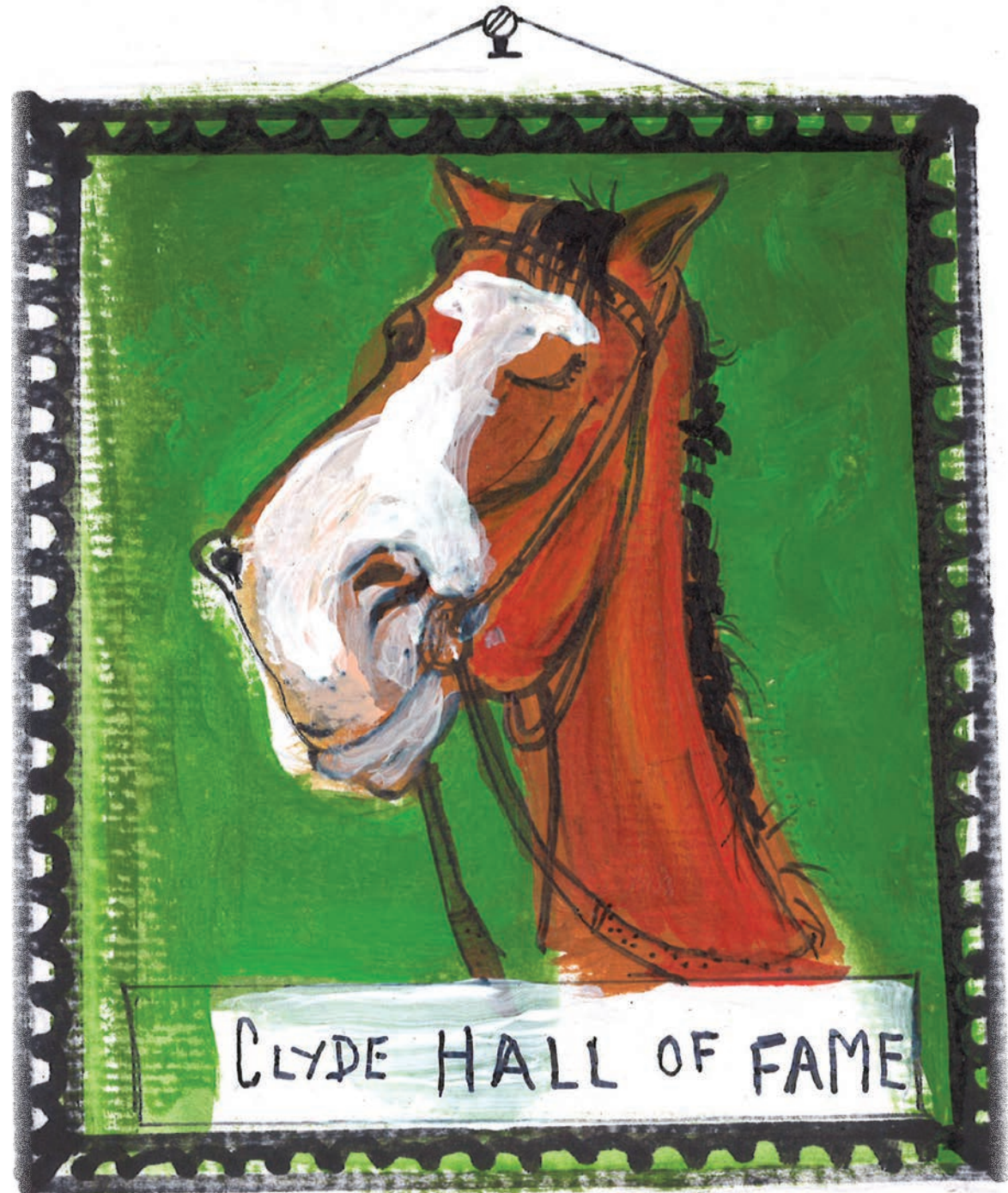




My trainer and owners took

No.... that definitely wasn't for me.



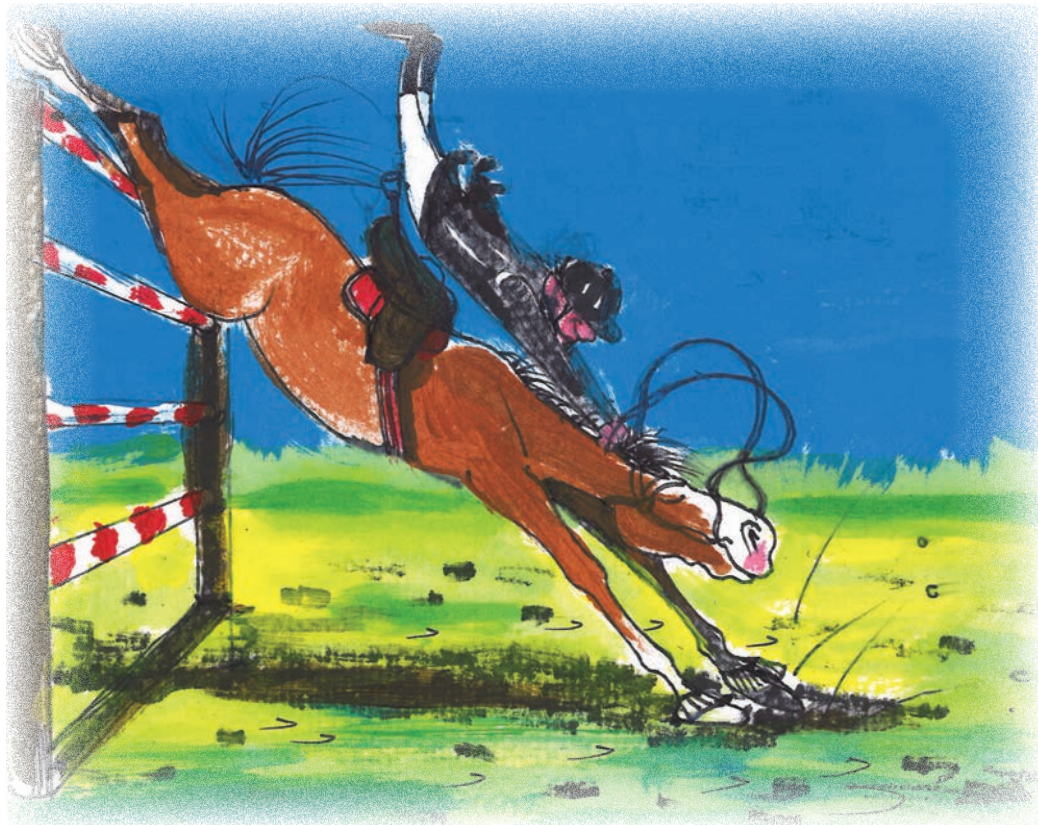




My days are very busy now,
