GAVIAR The star of Fremantle Cup

Betterthancheddar five-year-old Caviar Star upstaged more-fancied rivals to take out the \$300,000 Retravision Fremantle Cup (2526m) at Gloucester Park on January 10, extending Hall of Fame trainer Gary Hall Snr's unrivalled record to nine wins in the time-honoured race.

The gelding went into the feature event in solid form after returning two second-place finishes and a win at his three lead-up runs, however, he started on the fourth line of betting at \$7.50 in a race comprising of five runners from the strong stable of Greg and Skye Bond, as well as talented pacers Shockwave and Bill Haley.

Hall Snr is no stranger to racing at the elite level, having trained in excess of 50 Group 1 winners in his illustrious career to date, but it's fair to say that his latest Fremantle Cup triumph came as somewhat of a surprise to the legendary horseman.

"Leading up to the carnival I didn't think I'd have a horse in any of the good races, really," Hall Snr said.

"I was trying to qualify Caviar Star, Ideal Liner, Herrick Roosevelt and Speed Man.

"Speed Man had a hard run leading into it, then Herrick Roosevelt got into the Fremantle Cup but drew bad, and I actually thought he was probably a little bit better horse than what Caviar Star was at the time.





"But the thing about Caviar Star is he has real determination and that's what makes him so special.

"He's got a never-say-die attitude and I think that's what's held him in good stead.

"As far as ability goes, he's only limited, but he's as tough as any horse I've had."

Despite having tasted success in the Fremantle Cup on eight previous occasions, as well as winning three Inter Dominions and a record 11 WA Pacing Cups, Hall Snr appeared almost-unusually overjoyed following the win of Caviar Star.

He says the surprise factor made the achievement even more enjoyable, as well as sharing the moment with a relatively-new ownership group.

"I was pretty chuffed to win it because I was thinking that I couldn't possibly," he said.

"I thought he was a rough hope, but that he'd need every bit of luck he could possibly get.

"The owners have only come into my stable in the last couple of years, too, so it was great to see them have success in a race like that.

"It was a big thrill and we didn't pay a lot for him, either.

"I think he was about 60 grand landed in Perth from New Zealand, so he was relatively cheap, really."

Caviar Star's driver, 25-year-old New Zealand-born Stuart McDonald, crossed the ditch more than eight years ago and has called Australia home ever since.

After previous stints with Perth trainers Greg Schofield and Ross Olivieri, the former leading WA junior driver took up an

opportunity to work at Kevin Pizzuto's stable in Sydney in 2017 before relocating back to the west six months later.

It was upon his return that he secured a job working for Hall Snr and, now the stable's foreman, he says he had always dreamed of driving a Group 1 winner but didn't think it would be for his boss due to the dominance of WA's leading driver and Hall Snr's son, Gary Jnr.

"At the start I got told that I'd just be the stablehand and I had to work my way up and I'd get more opportunities the more work I do," McDonald said.

"I never thought I'd drive a Group 1 winner for Senior.

"He always has a few runners in those races, so I thought I might pick something up, but I definitely didn't think I'd ever be on the best chance in the race of ours.

"We might not always get along and we have our blues, but I have a lot of respect for him."

McDonald drove Caviar Star in the gelding's three last starts leading into the Fremantle Cup, however, as the stable's second-string driver, he says he wasn't confident of retaining the drive in the Group 1 event.

"I wasn't 100 per cent sure, because we had a couple of chances going into it and Junior hadn't been offered the drive on Shockwave yet," he said.

"It wasn't until a week before the race where it was found out that he was offered the drive on Shockwave and was going to take it, then I was told I was getting the drive on Caviar Star.

"After the draw I always thought I could win it from quite a few different positions, but I never got confident because I

just wasn't sure what was going to happen with so many Bond runners in the race.

"But I knew how good the horse was going leading into the race and then I knew at the 600 how good he was travelling, so it was just a matter of getting into the clear.

"In running, all I had to worry about was the last 500 metres and if I was going to have to get lucky or be able to force my way out somehow."

McDonald was able to obtain a clear passage passing the 400-metre mark before pulling the plugs and looming ominously approaching the home turn, however, race-leader Vampiro (\$23) kicked clear entering the straight.

Always up for a challenge, Caviar Star knuckled down to the task brilliantly, levelling up to the pacemaker at the 50-metre mark and pulling away late to snatch victory by a head.

Despite the small margin, however, McDonald ensured he salvaged the career-best moment by producing a celebratory salute in the shadows of the post.

"I thought about it all Friday morning because I thought I could win the race, but I thought I wouldn't be given the chance to salute in my first Group 1 because it'll probably be a really close race," he laughed.

"Then, half-way down the straight, I got really confident and thought, 'yep, I'll get it going'.

"Afterwards, I didn't know how to feel.

"I was surprised and happy, but it didn't hit me straight away.

"It wasn't until I finished my warm-down lap and saw all the owners and Senior celebrating and running up to me that I thought, 'okay, this is for real,'.

"It was an awesome feeling, but then I had to drive in the next race which took the buzz away a bit, so all I could think of was, 'I need to do that again'."

Usually one to downplay his performances in the sulky, McDonald was lauded by Hall Snr following the Fremantle Cup victory.

The champion trainer was quick to praise the under-rated ability of his newest Group 1-winning driver.

"Stewy's a pretty good driver," Hall Snr said.

"He stuck with Eloquent Mach all the way through his preparation and I kept him on.

"I think eventually he could make a driver of the top echelon."

Reflecting back on a period of dominance that has seen him conqueror the pinnacles of Australasian pacing, Hall Snr is surprised with the way his own career has unfolded.

He says the Fremantle Cup is one of many races that initially eluded him, however, as history would tell, the best-in-thewest continues to re-write the record books each season.

"I ran a hell of a lot of places in the Fremantle Cup before I could win one," he said.

"It took me a long time.

"I ran second a couple of times and third a couple of times, then (Gary Hall) Junior seemed to be the change in my success in my Group 1 races, that's for certain.

"I could never have imagined that I've ended up with the record I've got.

"I can't believe it, really.

"I remember just hoping that one day I could win a Fremantle

BONDS' CONQUER PACING CUP IN MIGHTY WAY

After chasing an elusive Pacing Cup victory without success for many years, the powerhouse husband-and-wife partnership of Greg and Skye Bond ticked the milestone off their bucket lists in emphatic fashion when training the trifecta of the \$450,000 Group 1 event on January 17.

The dynamite duo had a record seven runners engaged in the iconic feature, headed by race-favourite Galactic Star (\$4.20), but it was the progressive Mighty Conqueror (\$5.50) who took the honours from brave front-runner, Vampiro (\$9), and evergreen 11-year-old, Our Jimmy Johnstone (\$7.50).

Mighty Conqueror, an American Ideal five-year-old, had to overcome hoof bruising in the fortnight leading into

his grand final but outlined his class when sitting in the breeze and proving too strong for his stablemate over the concluding stages to score by a head.

Reflecting back on the triumph, Greg Bond says although the gelding had a less-than-ideal lead-up to the race, he still maintained confidence in his ability on the night.

"We had to wait through a process with Mighty Conqueror's sore foot," Bond said.

"We had to make some corrective shoeing and it was a bit of heart-in-mouth stuff at times going into it but, with our structure at home, we were still able to keep the work up to him so he went into the race lacking no fitness.





"We were fortunate enough to have the numbers this year, which helped, and some horses with good ability."

Galactic Star, a proven Inter Dominion heat and Group 2 winner, was regarded as the Bonds' number-one seed in the Pacing Cup after stable driver Ryan Warwick elected to drive the gelding in preference of its stablemates.

The previous week saw the seven-year-old gallop approaching the home turn after copping interference and he subsequently finished at the tail of the field, however, his luck didn't change in the Pacing Cup when being blocked at crucial stages.

"I thought Galactic Star was probably our best chance with clear running and, if he had've got clear running 300 out from home, I think he could've still won the race," Bond said.

"It wouldn't have been an easy decision for Ryan with the barrier draw, but I guess he went with the more proven horse and, things didn't work out for Galactic Star in that race, but he's since proven his form to be not too bad."

Asked to describe his feelings in the moments immediately before and after his Pacing Cup trifecta, Bond says he was filled with a range of emotions.

"Before the race, the warm-up leading up to the race seemed like it took forever because you get to a point where all the work is done," he said.

"Sometimes you feel like you just want it over with when they're on the track, so it was a long lead up.

Then, I don't know if relief is the right word, but you feel like you've achieved something that you've been chasing.

"You think of all the behind-the-scenes work, not just by Skye and myself, but your staff, vets and all of that stuff, and that you plan for these races months out.

"You feel like it is a mission accomplished, rather than anything else.

"A part of me would've liked to see Robbie Gartrell win, because he has a share in Vampiro and has been a great stable supporter but, other than that, I'm just happy to win the race."

Mighty Conqueror's winning driver in the Pacing Cup, Dylan Egerton-Green, was introduced to the Bond camp through his father-in-law and harness racing veteran, Colin Brown, as a junior driver.

The popular and well-respected 27-year-old took up an opportunity to become the stable's outright number-two driver to Warwick 18 months ago and has reaped the rewards ever since.

"Colin used to drive for Greg and Skye a lot and he got me in there a bit when Greg had claiming drives," Egerton-Green said.

"Jou feel like it is a mission accomplished, rather than anything else

"Ryan was Greg's number-one driver but, because Colin had slowed down a little bit, they were looking for someone who would be happy to drive their second stringers when they came up.

"When they asked me, I jumped at it and it's all just gone from there.

"Ryan's the number-one driver and gets the best drive on the night but, with their horses, it's whoever gets the best luck in the run because they're always a winning chance.

"They don't send them around with no hope."

It has been a whirlwind past nine months for Egerton-Green after scoring his first Group 1 victory aboard the Browntrained Patrickthepiranha in the Westbred Colts & Geldings Classic (2130m) on June 21 before returning his 500th win in the sulky aboard Sarah Suvaljko's Nowuseemesmile less than eight weeks later.

Looking back on his recent accomplishments, Egerton-Green says achieving the milestones on his biggest supporters' horses have made the moments even more special.

"I did a lot of work with Patrickthepiranha, because I'd been working him, so it was really good to get my first Group 1 for someone so close to me and a horse I'd done a lot of work with." he said.

"Ryan was happy to drive Galactic Star in the Pacing Cup and I'd driven Mighty Conqueror before, so they said I could drive him.

"It was always going to be tough because it's such a great race and nothing ever gets given to anyone.

"He had to do it the hard way and proved he was the best horse on the night.

"I wasn't overly confident going into it, but I thought he'd run a really good race."

Pacing Cup night proved to be even more fruitful for Egerton-Green when, three races after his Group 1 success, he led from go-to-whoa on a pacer he trains himself, Tyler Brett.

However, less than 24 hours after the best night of his career, he says he was quickly brought back down to earth.

"The day after the Pacing Cup I felt on top of the world, then I went to Bunbury on the Saturday arvo and I don't think I even ran a place," he laughed.

"I got brought back to reality pretty quick.

"But hopefully I can get some more opportunities to drive some nice horses in nice races now."

Bond, like many participants in the harness industry, speaks highly of Egerton-Green on-and-off the track.

He says the young gun's second Group 1 win in the space of 12 months is an appropriate result for the work he has put into his craft.

"Dylan did a lot of driving for us when he had his claim," Bond said.

"He's always been held in high regard by both Skye and myself, not just as a driver, but as a person as well.

"We got to the stage where the numbers were up and I spoke to him about 18 months ago about wanting him to be our second string and asked how that would sit with him, and he was very happy for the opportunity.

"He's driven great and he's a quality young man who's a hard worker and gets on with the job, so winning the Cup is probably just reward for someone like him who has put the effort it."

A clearly-delighted Bond took immense satisfaction from adding his and his wife's name to the WA Pacing Cup honour roll, however, he says it was back to business as always following the feature win.

"The Pacing Cup is the marquee race to win on the local calendar and we've completed that now, so it gave us the full book," he said.

"We've won the Slipper, the Derby, the Oaks, the Nugget and the Fremantle Cup, so that was probably the only one missing out of the mantle-piece, so to speak.

"But, 10 minutes after the race Skye was planning for next year, so you move on pretty quick.

"There's always something on next week or next month that you've got to prepare your horses for, so you're always focusing on the next project."

The club was founded in 1944 with the first race meeting held in February 1945.



THE 1952 CARNIVAL PRELUDE TO THE 1953 INTERS

The unprecedented success of the 1950 Christmas Carnival, which saw NZ super star Single Direct stamp his superiority over a strong contingent of locals, marked the start of a flood of visiting stars to Gloucester Park in the 1950's. Royal Shadow, a gallant runner up to Single Direct in the Golden Jubilee Federation Cup of January 1st, 1951 had one of his many highlights under lights when successful in the following year's version of WA's premier race for Pop and Max Johnson, but with the 1953 Interdominion Series scheduled for Gloucester Park in February, the Christmas Carnival would see an early arrival become the first horse ever to travel by air transport for a WA harness meeting.

The Tasmanian Champion Floodlight would be bought to Perth 11 weeks early by his ace trainer driver Don Cornish in an attempt to gain an edge in both fitness and acclimatization, with Perth summers being traditionally a lot harsher than those back in Tasmania. Whilst other early travelers such as Tennessee Sky and Pick On would also arrive early in the middle of December, they travelled by the more traditional sea journey but arrived a little stiff and sore from the long journey and they could not contest the Christmas Carnival. Floodlights 18 hour air journey from Sydney was a walk in the park compared to the journey by sea

Although light in condition as he stepped off the plane, master trainer Cornish quickly bought Floodlight to hand and he was able to trial him into second place behind Kolect Again at Gloucester Park on December 14th prior to contesting a heat of the Christmas Handicap. Qualifying him for both the Christmas Handicap Final and the WA Cup would see him have the opportunity to pick up good prizemoney prior to the beginning of the 19,000 pound Interdominion Series on February 18. However, Floodlight, 3rd in the previous year's Interdominion Final at Harold Park to the champion Avian Derby and Recovered, and renowned throughout Australia, would have a rising local star to deal with in the form of Bill Foy's brilliant 4 year old Beau Don, as well as perennial crowd favourite Kellett. Beau Don had only started 14 times prior to the carnival but had won 11 times including the WA Derby and the Sires Produce Stakes and been unplaced on only 1 occasion. Floodlight, whose full sister Desmouth was destined for harness racing immortality as the dam of the mighty Halwes, already had an imposing record in addition to his Interdominion placing at Harold Park, having already won the 1952 AG Hunter Cup, just one of his eventual 36 victories across all Australian States with the exclusion of Queensland.

The first round of 12 heats of the Christmas Handicap got under way on Saturday December 6th, and with only heat winners qualifying for the 2,600 pound final, it was Kolect Again who drew first blood for Athol Robertson when he led all the way in defeating Trader (D.Martin) and Don Thomas's Hasty Nelson. Bob Pollock took a freelance drive on Rhoda's Gift and cruised home an easy winner over Kratsa Dan (W.Scott) and Retinue (Frank Kersley) in the second heat. In winning the 3rd heat of the night, Beau Don advanced to a 2.11 mark, thus making him eligible for the WA Cup on January 1. After galloping out and losing ground at the start, driver Bill Foy took advantage of the slow early pace to win easing up over Sandridge (Lorne Richter) and Beaudale (Ron Porter).

The December 13 round of heats saw the 7/4 favourite Red Hussar take out heat 4 for Fred Kersley with Trader once again the runner up with Speedy Van in 3rd for Max Johnson but the slow mile rate 2.14 indicated it was one of the weaker heats. Kratsa Dan rated 2.10 3/4 in easily winning heat 5 over Fred Kersley's Happy Mint with Telluride (Harold Richter) back in 3rd, whilst visiting Interdominion nominee Retinue franked his good form with a win in heat 6 for Frank Kersley over San Guy (Alan Woodworth) and Wirradale (Max Johnson). However, the star of the night was the recent import from New Zealand, Dillon Grattan. The son of Dillon Hall, though only contesting a minor race, would go on to be a standout sire in WA after arriving on the same vessel that bought NZ Champion single Direct to Perth for the Christmas Carnival 2 years earlier. He recorded his 6th consecutive win after travelling 3 and 4 wide for the first mile before scoring an emphatic victory. The 700 pound Free For All that night was won by Norm Duncan's Game Globe, driven by Harold Richter, but it



was marred by a bad fall that resulted in the favourite British Machine being unfortunately euthanized post-race.

The 3rd round of heats, Saturday December 20th, could well have been labelled "Raider Domination Night" with the legendary sire producing 3 of the 7 winners (Steorra, Dainty Patsy and Floodlight), whilst Scott's Way, later to achieve fame as the sire of world record holder Dainty's Daughter, won his Qualifying Stakes as a 2/1 on favourite, posting a very pedestrian 2.15 mile rate. Heat 7 of the Christmas Handicap went to Harry Moran's Dainty Patsy who defeated Kolfast (Frank Kersley) and Speedy Van (Max Johnson) and Hasty Nelson made amends in Heat 8 scoring a narrow win for Don Thomas over Happy Mint (Fred Kersley), with Trader running a third consecutive placing in the heats to be branded the unluckiest contestant of the heats. The race of the night however was in heat 9 when Floodlight beat Kellett (also sired by Raider) in sensational circumstances, prevailing by a mere 3 inches after Kellett mixed its gait after heading Floodlight in the straight. Beaudale (Ron Porter) ran 3rd on a night when the course patrons where agog with the news that a serial poisoner had killed Tasmanian champion Payray and his full brother Herbray overnight in Launceston, by administering Strychnine to both horses. Payray had won the Newton Free For All in record time the day before and was scheduled to travel to Victoria for the Hunter Cup prior to coming to Perth for the Interdominion Series. At the same time, handicaps were released for the Interdominion with reigning champion Avian Derby receiving an imposing 48 yard handicap. Avian Derby was in fine form having outclassed a strong field in the Wayville Mile the week before.

The final set of heats was contested on Boxing night and the winners would have little time to recover in readiness for the Final the next evening. 5/4 favourite Happy Mint was successful in heat 10 over Kolfast and Telluride, Speedy Van scored as an even money favourite for Max Johnson over Wilbourne (Jim Kinnear) and Prince Hall (Frank Kersley) in heat 11, whilst Sandridge won the final heat for Lorne Richter accounting for Lily Girl (W.Read) and Remlap (R.Pollock). Punters were of the view that provided Beau Don stepped cleanly in the final, he may have too much speed for both Floodlight and Rhoda's Gift.

However, there was to be a substantial twist as the tale of the final unfolded, accompanied by great controversy. Trainer Ray Williams sprung a late driving change on Kratsa Dan after regular driver W.V.Scott reported that under medical advice, he would "not be able to do full justice to Kratsa Dan" and ace driver Alan Woodworth was engaged. Kratsa Dan was heavily supported into 4/1 second favourite behind Beau Don (7/4), and rumours were rife that the Woodworth Stable backers had invested heavily, in spite of denials from both Stan ("I never invested a penny") and Alan Woodworth. Kratsa Dan, in winning from the scratch mark by 18 inches over Happy Mint (12 yrds) and Floodlight (36 yrds), took 4 1/2 seconds off Royal Shadow's previous race state record after recording a time of 3.30 for the 13 furlongs (2600m). With Beau Don pulled out of the race after a tardy beginning along with Kolect Again, all eyes now turned to the upcoming WA Cup to be held on Jan 2.

Another huge crowd turned out for the Thursday Night, January 1st WA Trotting Cup with a full field of 14 to contest

the 3,600 pound race with the 3 main fancies all drawn on the scratch mark. Kellett (5/2) who had easily beaten Bintravis in a FFA on the night of the Christmas Handicap Final, was suspect at the distance and had been missing the start recently and the favourite at 5/4 was Floodlight with Beau Don at 7/4. Kellett predictably blew the start and it was Beau Don who careered away to an 18 yard victory over the courageous Kellett whilst Floodlight weakened in the straight to be 5 yards away in 3rd place. It would take a race record from Beau Don and driver Bill Foy, who ran the 2 miles in 4 min 20 ½ seconds to spread-eagle the field at a 2.10 ¼ mile rate. Last year's victor Royal Shadow (24 yrds) was a further 5 yards away in 4th place after coming off an interrupted preparation and he couldn't overcome his back mark. In winning the cup, Beau Don took his record to 13 wins from 17 starts and over 7,500 pounds in stakemoney. He was heavily supported with a number of bets of 1000 to 500 pounds landed and he returned to a thunderous reception.

The very consistent Trader, placed in all 3 attempts in the Christmas Handicap heats, was finally in the winner's circle on Cup night when the Raider entire accounted for Kratsa Dan and Dainty Patsy in the 2.16 and better Association handicap, with Rhodas Gift also backing up from the Christmas Handicap final to defeat Kolfast in the other 2.16 and better handicap. Horses were there to be raced in the 1950's with the toughness of the colonially pedigreed Standardbred very well to the fore.

With the Carnival now complete, all eyes now turned to the upcoming 1953 Interdominion Series in February. With a stellar list of nominations and a number of contestants already having arrived in Perth, the stage was set for a memorable series. With two past winners in Avian Derby and Captain Sandy entered, along with established stars of the day like Floodlight, the mighty Ribands, Inters placegetter Recovered, the brilliant New Zealand mare Blue Mist, the enduring Bruce Hall and future champ Tennessee Sky, along with star drivers that were household names of the 1950's such as Perc Hall, Sylvester Bray and Freeman Holmes, it would be left to an ageing outsider, a master trainer and his young driver to pull off one of the great feats of Interdominion History — Captain Sandy , Dinny Nolan and Bob Pollock — but that is another story for another day.

Vale Joe Petricevich

Astute trainer Joe Petricevich, a leading light in harness racing in Western Australia in the 1950s, 60s and 70s, passed away on 17 January 2020 at the age of 97.

Phil Petricevich, the youngest of his ten children, said it was quite moving that his father died just moments before the 12 runners got under way for the \$450,000 WA Pacing Cup at Gloucester Park. It was on January 1, 1962 that Joe Petricevich achieved his most important success as an owner and trainer when Beau Travis, driven by Fred Kersley jnr and six days before his 23rd birthday, finished brilliantly and won by almost three lengths from the pacemaker Peppercorn in the 2450 pound (\$4900) WA Trotting Cup over two miles, witnessed by an enthusiastic crowd of 16,000.

A great conditioner of pacers and an excellent judge of a young horse, Joe Petricevich purchased Beau Travis as a yearling for 36 pounds (\$72) and the gelding earned more than \$20,000 in a wonderful career, which included a victory over Gay Society and Copper Chief in the 1958 WA Derby.

Petricevich also won the 1964 WA Derby with the brilliant Rising Scott beating Good Grattan and Tugman.

The distinctive Petricevich livery of red and gold horseshoes was also carried to victory by top-flight pacers Beau Corse (purchased for 80 pounds), Shagrim and Coneeda. Beau Corse notched his 16th win when Kersley drove him to victory over Defiance and Leuros in the 1961 Winter Cup; Kersley was also in the sulky when Shagrim won the 1967 Navy Cup and when Coneeda won the 1967 Fremantle Cup --- shortly after starting at 33/1 and finishing second to Binshaw in the 1967 Interdominion championship final.

Petricevich also enjoyed considerable success in the 1990s with Picture Son (16 wins) and Theresa Franco (seven wins).



Vale Dudley Anderson

Dudley Kenneth Anderson, affectionately known as Boof throughout his long and distinguished career in harness racing, died aged 88 on Tuesday 28 January 2020.

A blacksmith by trade, he also was an astute trainer and skilful reinsman who drove a winner of a WA Derby, a Fremantle Cup and a Miracle Mile at Sydney's Harold Park

He also had a keen eye when selecting a horse and it was on his recommendation that WA trainer Bill Horn and Gordon and Cecelia Cox purchased Village Kid for \$36,000 after the pacer had won at three of his first nine starts in New Zealand. Trained by Horn, Village Kid developed into a superstar who raced 160 times for 93 wins, 25 seconds, 12 thirds and \$2,117,870 in prizemoney.

The highlight of Anderson's career was when he drove Royal Force (trained by Wagin farmer George Kennett) to victory over Paleface Adios and Markovina in the Miracle Mile at Harold Park in March 1977. Anderson also drove Royal Force when the pacer finished third behind Pure Steel and Paleface Adios in the 1977 Hunter Cup in Melbourne and when he won the Fremantle Cup that year. Two years later, Royal Force was third behind Pure Steel and Koala King in the WA Pacing Cup.

Anderson also achieved great success with several pacers he trained and drove, including Smooth Dave, Regal Counsel, Southern Knight and Just Mick. Regal Counsel, a chestnut, won the 1972 James Brennan Cup, Smooth Dave scored a notable victory over Classic Garry in the 1982 WA Derby and Southern Knight finished second to Flashing Star in the 1994 Golden Nugget championship. The WA-bred Southern Knight went on to finish second to Justaboyden in the 1995 WA Pacing Cup and third behind Our Sir Vancelot and Norms Daughter in the 1997 WA Pacing Cup.
